At the FIBUSPAM clinic, we sustained and persevered. Despite the overwhelmed health system in Ecuador and minimal local resources, PACH was able to provide adequate support to FIBUSPAM to meet the demand for healthcare and keep our local team of doctors, nurses, and support staff intact.

Putting themselves at risk daily, our local colleagues at FIBUSPAM were able to pivot to tackle Covid-19 head-on and provided Covid-19 screening and education to thousands of patients, and treatment and care for hundreds more.

Although 2020 was marked by the loss of a number of patients and close friends of the PACH and FIBUSPAM family, our work was also a catalyst for stories of survival, hope, and perseverance for the people that we serve.

The funding that PACH and FIBUSPAM received in 2020 truly saved lives in Ecuador. We are so grateful for the continued support of the PACH and FIBUSPAM family and we are so grateful that our organizations were able to not only sustain but make measurable impacts in the lives and health of others in 2020.

As we look again to 2021 and the whole world refocuses on public health, preventative care, and self-care as a continued priority, our mission of supporting enduring healthcare solutions to Ecuadorian populations most in need has become even more important.

When it is safe to do so, we can't wait to begin medical missions and volunteer trips to Ecuador again and engage with all of you in person.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHT:

SIMON BOLIVAR FOUNDATION GRANT PROJECT

In December 2019, PACH and FIBUSPAM were awarded a grant from the Simon Bolivar Foundation to host a free clinic for Venezuelan immigrants and refugees in Ecuador. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the program was delayed a few months until FIBUSPAM staff were able to safely provide routine care. In June 2020, PACH and FIBUSPAM were able to successfully provide free medical, dental, and vision care to 172 Venezuelan immigrants and refugees over the course of one week. The 172 patients were made up of 118 adults and 54 children and included free medicines and exams when needed. The project also served as a way to connect the FIBUSPAM clinic with the Venezuelan community in Ecuador. From this project, Venezuelans in Ecuador now know about the subsidized and low-cost services provided by FIBUSPAM year-round and that the care is free from discrimination and prejudice. PACH and FIBUSPAM intend to continue finding ways to support the Venezuelan community in Ecuador. We thank the Simon Bolivar Foundation for their support.





PROJECT HIGHLIGHT:

NEXT WORLD NOW FOUNDATION GRANT PROJECT



In September 2020, PACH and FIBUSPAM received a grant from the Next World Now Foundation in support of a project to purchase computers for all consulting rooms and implement an electronic medical records system. FIBUSPAM's prior system of paper medical records was extremely time consuming and prone to error. The Next World Now Foundation recognized FIBUSPAM's need for a medical records system and provided a grant for its implementation. The Jean Axelrod Foundation also provided a generous donation to the project, noting the steep start-up costs associated with an EMR system. PACH and FIBUSPAM have been working together over the past 9 months purchasing computers for all consulting rooms, creating manuals to detail the systems' use, and customizing the system to fit FIBUSPAM's needs. In the coming months, we hope to fully implement the system and document the results. We thank the Next World Now and Jean Axelrod Foundations for their support.

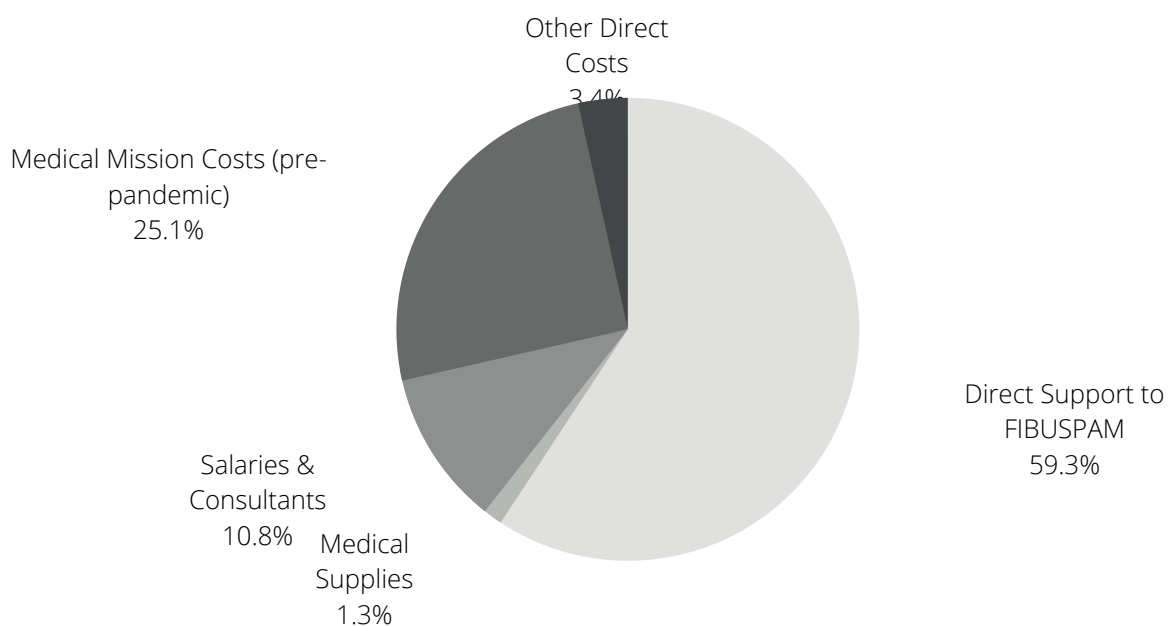
